Bio for Kenneth E. Lane, Ed.D.

Kenneth E. Lane, Ed.D., is a retired Professor of Educational Leadership most recently from Southeastern Louisiana University, where he taught education law, school finance, and educational leadership to doctoral students making extensive use of the Internet and online applications. Additionally, he served as the initial Director of the Doctoral Program in Educational Leadership for seven years. He has previously served as the Director of the National Center for Excellence in Education at California State University, San Bernardino, which worked with the U.S. Navy to develop and deliver skill content via the Internet its civilian workforce as well as to develop simulations to teach leadership skills in critical thinking and decision making. Dr. Lane is a Past President of the Education Law Association and is the Executive Director of the International Academy of Educational Leaders. Dr. Lane has over 150 publications including refereed journal articles, books, and book chapters as well as over 160 conference presentations. He has also served in 14 editorship positions and on 12 editorial boards. In 2000, he received the inaugural Faculty Leadership Award from California State University, San Bernardino in recognition of his teaching excellence in distributed learning as well as being the first professor to teach online at the university. Dr. Lane also helped facilitate a program for faculty from the Universidad de Autonoma de Baja California in Mexicali, Mexico to enable its

education faculty to earn a Master's degree from California State University, San Bernardino in special education. Additionally, Dr. Lane has led education delegations for People to People to China and South Africa. Currently, Dr. Lane is serving as a volunteer at St. Tammany Parish Hospital (STPH) in an effort to give back to the community and also serving a two year term as President of the STPH Volunteer Guild. Dr. Lane earned his Bachelor of Science degree from Indiana State University, Master of Education degree from the University of Missouri – St. Louis, and Doctor of Education degree from Texas A&M University – Commerce.
