 ESY – Extended school year (regression/recoupment)

Background

- Prevention is better than winning as there are no real winners in special education cases.

IEP Team





- (2) not less than 1 regular education teacher of such child (if the may be, participating in the regular education environment;
- (3) not less than 1 special education teacher
- (4) a representative of the local educational agency
- (5) a person who can interpret the instructional implications of the evaluation
- (6) at the discretion of the parent, a person with knowledge or special expertise regarding the child, including <u>related services</u> <u>personnel as appropriate</u>; and
- (7) whenever appropriate, the child with a disability."

Procedure Safeguards?

- If too many procedural safeguards are violated, it may constitute substantive violation.
 - o Time
 - o Personnel
 - o Notifications



IEP

- Individualized Education Plan Rowley (Must provide some educational benefit, what does that mean?) New standard – Endrew F. v. Douglas County School District RE-1
- "Appropriately ambitious in light of his circumstances" Every child should have the chance to meet challenging objectives.
- More than merely de minimis!

Rights transfer when child reaches 18 unless interdicted

Least Restrictive Environment

<u>Placement</u>

- Program, not location
- If remove from program for more than 10 days in a school year without new IEP, it is considered a unilateral change of placement by the district.
- Issues?
 - o Discipline
 - Lack of services
 - Uncertified teacher

Stay Put

- Option available to parents when seeking a Due Process Hearing (see LRE issues)
- Stay in same placement unless district obtains a Honig Injunction. (the school has to prove that if the student stays where s/he is, someone is likely to get hurt. They have to show that keeping the student out is the only way to protect everyone)
- The school can move a child for up to 45 school days (even if parent disagrees) if keeping child in current placement is likely to result in injury to self or others. For example, if a child was dealing drugs or carrying a weapon, the school can make the change temporarily.
- During those 45 school days, the school is required to provide services to address the child's behavioral problems.

Due Process Hearing

- Requested by either party
- BOP is on party requesting hearing!
- Decision within 45 days
- Mediation is option

Due Process Hearing Requests

- Due process hearings are designed to decide issues affecting the placement of individual children
- The only parties entitled to file due process requests are parents/guardians, school districts or students 18 years of age or older
- Results in a legally binding decision on both parties, unless the decision is changed or overturned on appeal
